Start off the New Year with an embrace of the elements, good exercise and the diverse beauty of our Sonoma coast! This approximately four-mile*, three+ hour moderate loop hike will take us first to our ocean bluff to experience the morning high King Tide and pinnipeds on the rocky islets nearby. Then we'll cross Highway One (at mile marker 34) then gradually ascend into the towering redwood and fir forest mostly along an old logging road, visiting en route both the Call Family and Stanley Spyra Memorial redwood groves. Enjoying our bag lunch picnic along the way, we'll cross the San Andreas Fault line plus have the option of visiting our historic Fort Ross orchard nearby.

Meet at 10:30am at FRSHP Visitor Center. Bring water, bag lunch, binoculars, cameras, layered clothing, hiking boots (be prepared for some possible moisture) and optional hiking sticks. Not recommended for kids under eight and sorry, no dogs permitted. California State Parks day use parking fees apply.
